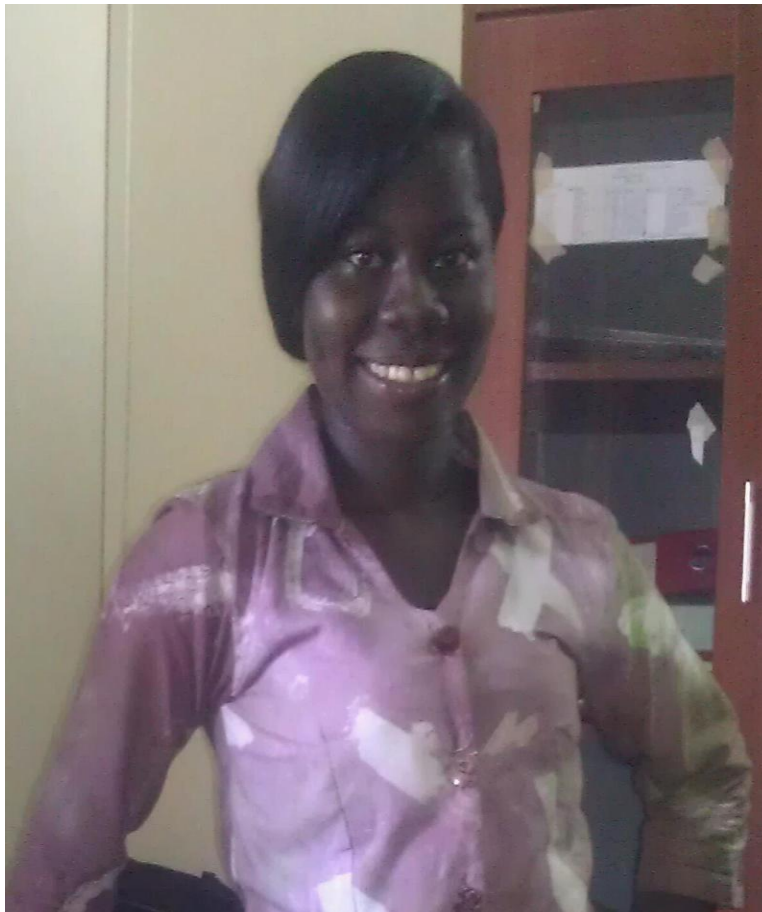


Irene Takyiwaa Mensah
