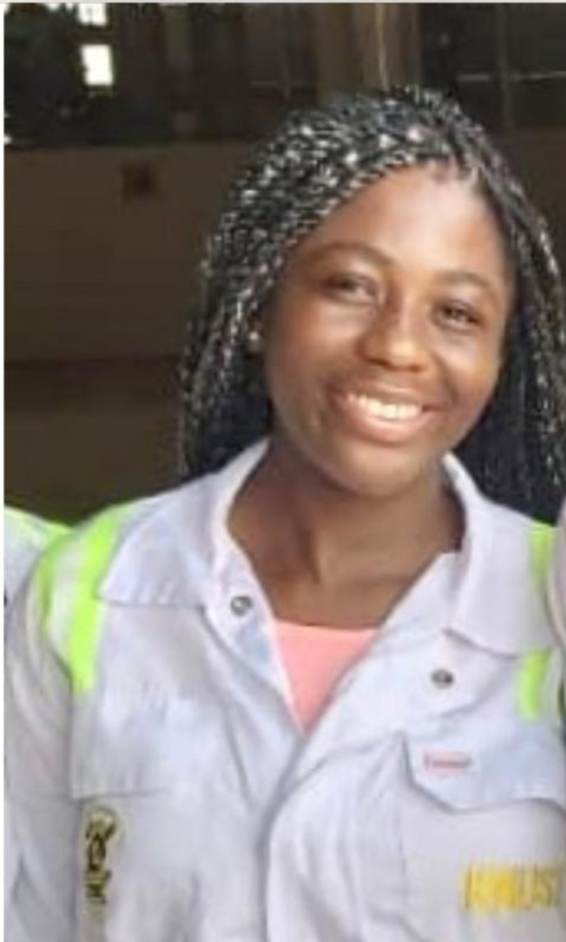


## MARYLYN ODURO AWUAH
